Water-wise planting can help to conserve water in our semi-arid area. Landscaping with native species such as Yucca and Rabbit grass provides ground cover that does not require additional watering. There are also many non-native species that require minimal watering. The Southeastern Water Conservancy District in Pueblo, Colorado, provides extensive information on xeric planting including lists of xeric plants. Please visit: www.secwcd.org. In our experience, Pleasant Avenue Nursery in Buena Vista carries the largest variety of drought tolerant plants in this area. The staff there are also happy to advise you on your water conserving landscaping needs.
